## Acer campestre Redshine

A unique cultivar of our native tree, admired for its stunning foliage that evolves and changes throughout the summer. In the spring, an abundance of small yellow green flowers that are chartreuse in colour adorn the branches. These are a valuable food source for numerous bee species and butterflies after the long winter. These flowers contrast beautifully against the deep Crimson red of the opening leaves in Spring.


As the summer days become hotter, the succulent ruby leaves evolve and darken to a lush green red. The

underside of the leaves are a rich green, which are much darker than all other campestre.



Come the autumn, the tree does a 180, where the winged seeds display warm, eloquent colours of cardinal red, whilst the leaves contrast these with a canopy dripped in liquid golden shades of yellow.

Perfect for something different, it is literally the perfect choice for narrow streets and urban locations. The Red Shine has a tighter form, only reaching 4m at its widest, whilst being extremely hardy against drought and air pollution. It establishes well within almost all soils, including hard paving and soil compaction, and is also salt tolerant. An ideal choice for areas with storm water run off and salt spreading applications.
